The Registrar welcomed all the members of the Academic Council and informed the Council that the quorum required for the meeting was satisfactory. The Registrar requested Hon. Vice-Chancellor to start the meeting.

Hon. Vice-Chancellor congratulated Dr. Aloorkar, I/c. Dean (Pharmacy) and Dr.(Mrs) Gogte, I/c. Dean (Architecture) as the new members of Academic Council. The Council welcomed these new members.

**Item No. 1: To confirm the minutes of the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2018**

The draft minutes of the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2018 were sent to the members of the Academic Council for their comments. The minutes were placed for confirmation before the Academic Council. Dr. Choudhary from JD COE, Nagpur, had suggested some points, which were discussed in the meeting as separate agenda points. Therefore, these points were recorded in the meeting as separate points.

“ Resolved that the minutes of the meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> June be and are confirmed.”

**Item No. 2: Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2018**

The Item-wise Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2018 was tabled before the Academic Council. The Council discussed the same. Dr. Choudhary pointed out regarding admission to failed students from parent University to DBATU University was not discussed in the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting. It was clarified that the matter was taken up during principal’s meeting to expedite the process of admission in July 2018. It was requested to ratify the same. The Council ratified the same point.

Resolved that the action taken report on the minutes of the meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> June 2018 be and is confirmed.”

**Item No. 3: To brief and approve progress of the Affiliation for A. Y. 2019-20**

The Registrar requested Dr. B.F.Jogi, Affiliation In-charge, to present the status and progress of the Affiliation for AY 2019-20 before the Academic Council. Dr. Jogi presented the status of the affiliation process.

- He informed that for AY 2019-20, as a response to the advertisement **Total of 144 colleges including new affiliation and continuation of affiliation have submitted the online proposals, out of 180 registered** on the portal of affiliation.
- The details of New colleges applied for affiliation are as under;

Accordingly, the Scrutiny Committees were constituted by the Planning & Monitoring Board. The Scrutiny of the proposals was completed between 29<sup>th</sup> November and 1<sup>st</sup> December 2018.

The Council was informed further that from this year a transparent on-line procedure has been set-up. Online reports have been generated and the concerned institution can see the deficiencies pointed out and immediately rectify these deficiencies.

The recommendations of proposals of new institutions were submitted to Government on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018. The Council was further informed that during AY 2018-19, by order of the Court, 10 institutions were granted affiliation and their LIC visit have been pending. The Scrutiny reports were also generated online and were informed to the respective concerned institutions. Some of the institutions are lagging behind in completing their criteria. The Council members discussed the matter. It was informed by the Vice-Chancellor that these institutions have been granted affiliation through Court. The Academic Council suggested to constitute a Committee for formation of LIC for the new institutions. A committee of following Academic Council members is constituted, who will prepare the List of LICs, by evolving appropriate norms for eligibility for nomination, keeping in mind the UGC regulation for the same.

This task of deciding LIC committees be completed before 5<sup>th</sup> February 2019. Also it was directed by the Council that BoE meeting be conducted before 31<sup>st</sup> January 2019. Controller of Examination should co-ordinate this meeting.

Also it was brought to the notice of the Academic Council that a confidential letter received from SRTM University Nanded against a few faculty of M.S.Bidve college of Engineering Latur regarding the malpractices in examinations. The Council discussed this matter and directed to a call explanation and issue show cause notice to the M.S.Bidve Institute mentioning why similar action should not be taken against the respective persons involved in these malpractices. Board of Examination is requested to submit the report.

The Council noted the progress and status of the affiliation. “Resolved that as per above direction, the actions be taken.”

#### **Item No. 4: To approve minutes of various faculty meetings**

The Registrar informed the Academic Council that during the last few months, meetings of faculty in three disciplines were held. Dr. Katti, I/c. Dean, Engineering was requested to present the minutes of Faculty of Engineering and Technology. He presented the matter before the Council. A copy of the minutes is enclosed herewith for information as **Annexure-I**. The Academic Council approved the minutes with following corrections and additions.

##### **1. Course code and credit for PhD Course Seminar**

Dr. Katti informed the members that it was proposed to have a separate subject code “R101S” to be used for PhD course work and will carry 03 credits. All the members agreed on and accepted the proposal.

“Resolved that the course code and 3 credit for PhD seminar be approved.”

##### **2. Correction of typographic error in Rule R 3.1.12 of the First Rules and Regulations of the University**

As per Rule R 3.1.12 (2) of the First Rules and Regulations of the University:

“After the allotment of provisional registration numbers and passwords all the candidates will be allotted theory course of minimum six credits (three contact hours per week) by the respective research committees on the recommendation of his/her research guide within a period of six months.”

The Controller of Examinations explained to the members that the rule was adopted from the Ph.D Rules and Regulations of the University framed in Dec 2012. At that time the credit allocation policy was to allocate two credits for one hour of theory course. However as per the present credit allocation policy of the University, one credit is assigned for one contact hour of the theory course. Hence with reference to the mention of “three contact hours per week” in the above mentioned rule R 3.1.12 (2) Corresponds to three credits. Therefore, it is proposed that the above mentioned rule R 3.1.12 (2) be corrected as:

“After the allotment of provisional registration numbers and passwords all the candidates will be allotted theory course of minimum **three** credits (three contact hours per week) by the respective research committees on the recommendation of his/her research guide within a period of six months.”

Further, as per As per Rule R 3.1.12(6), “The candidate will also have to submit a seminar report and present the same as open seminar at the Department Level. The seminar will be of four credits.”

However, the requirement of the seminar is already mentioned in R 3.1.12(5), hence the Rule R 3.1.12(6) be omitted.

### **3. Course code revision of F.Y.B Tech**

Dr. Katti informed the members that some discrepancies were observed in the course codes for FY B Tech course (revised in AY 2018-19) which was rectified during the first meeting of Faculty of Engineering & Technology and have been unified as per the **Annexure-II**

“Resolved that the course code revision be approved.”

### **4. Promotion Rules for M. Tech Courses:**

Dr. Katti informed the members that it was requested by some of the members of BoE during meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> September 2018 that the promotion rules for students to be promoted to the Second year be relaxed and all the students be promoted to second year without considering the 60% credit completion from first year. The matter was discussed in the first meeting of the Faculty of Engineering & Technology and also in the meeting of Board of Deans. However, the proposal for promotion of the students without 60% credits completed was not accepted. Different opinions were expressed by the members on the issue.

“Resolved that the students be allowed to continue for dissertation work and submit the same after completion of course work.”

## **5. Re- registration of students for improvement of CA and MSE marks**

Dr. Katti informed the members that there are requests received from the institutes and students for re-registration for the course along with the Continuous assessment and Mid Semester Examination. He informed the members that it was decided in the Faculty of Engineering and Technology to offer such facility of reregistering for the course can be given to the students on payment of the examination fees for the subjects only in case if the students has failed in Continuous Assessment and Mid Semester Examination. Further such registration will only be possible in the corresponding semester only (i.e. odd to odd and even to even semester only).

However, the Council differed with the proposal and decided not to allow the students for reregistration of the course along with mid semester exam and CA.

“Resolved that the student be permitted to register for the complete course as and when it is offered.”

## **6. Change in rule for revaluation of answer papers:**

Dr. Katti informed the members that there are some cases where the students has applied for revaluation and their marks were reduced. Due to which the students who were earlier promoted to second year are now in not promoted state. The Academic Council discussed this issue in greater detail. The Council members opined that the earlier limit for minimum 10% change in marks obtained after revaluation be removed and any **positive change** in revaluation marks should be considered for calculation of revaluation results.

“Resolved that only positive change in the marks be considered for calculation of revaluation results and promoted state to be retained. If the marks are reduced after revaluation, then the change will not be considered and the marks obtained originally will be retained.”

## **7. Re-exam and grace marks for students participating in inter-University competitions**

Dr. Katti informed the members about a proposal from the Board of Sports of the University for awarding additional grace marks and conducting separate End Semester Examination for the students who miss their End Semester Examinations due to participating and representing the University in Inter-University Sports competitions.

The members deliberated and expressed the consent upon conduction of separate end semester examination for such students. It was opined that such facility should be available for all types of cultural, sports or technical competitions and a separate end semester examination may be conducted for the students who miss the end semester examination.

“Resolved that re-examination be extended to the students, those who are participating and representing the University only at National and International level competitions.”

#### **8. Remedial Examination for the students remaining absent in end semester examinations**

Dr. Katti informed the members that it was proposed in the Faculty of Engineering and Technology that if the students has missed the end-semester examination due to severe illness and is hospitalized, or due to death of his mother, father or siblings, or he/she is representing the University in Inter-University competitions, he/she should be allowed for remedial examination as special case with due permission and authentication from the University/college Authorities. The members differed on this proposal and opined the remedial examination cannot be substitute for the regular examination. It was originally proposed only for candidate who have been continuously failing in certain subjects, to help them to reduce their back way.

“Resolved that the student remaining absent in End semester examination will not be allowed to appear for the remedial exam.”

#### **9. Disposal of used/written answer papers of the previous semesters.**

The Controller of Examinations informed the members that we have approximately 1.5 lakh used answer papers of previous Academic Year which are scanned and the results are already declared. The number is likely to be increased every semester and for the current semester the number of answer papers used is expected to be 1.3 lakhs (i.e about 2.6 lakhs for the Academic Year 2018-19). Right now we have scanning centers only at three locations namely at Lonere, Kolhapur (Vathar), and Jalgaon. Out of which the scanning center is being run in a rented premise at Kolhapur ( Vathar), and Jalgaon. Hence, we are facing problems with keeping these answer papers at these centers.

Moreover, it may please be noted that we have adopted the policy of digital evaluation. Thus each paper is scanned before evaluation. Thus the soft copy of the answer papers are always with us which can be used as evidence in case of any discrepancies.

In view of the above mentioned facts, it is requested to suggest and formulate the policy for disposal of used/written answer papers at regular intervals.

The members suggested to dispose of the used/written answer papers after one year after the declaration of results.

**10. Letter received from Section Officer, Government of Maharashtra regarding Examination Section dated September 19, 2018**

The controller of Examinations presented the statistics of winter 2017 and Summer 2018 examinations, regarding the points raised in the letter mentioned above. The members expressed their opinions about the statistics.

Resolved that the committee appointed under the chairmanship of Dr. Mahajan should submit the report at the earliest. A decision for implementation of separate heads of passing can be taken based on the report.

**11. Nomination of a member on the Selection Committee for Selection of Principal/Director**

Dr. Katti informed the Academic Council that as per the University Act and Rules and Regulations, the University has to constitute the Expert Committee for appointments of principals/ deans/directors of affiliated colleges/recognized institutes: The Rules are as under.

- (1) Principals/ Deans/ Directors of affiliated Colleges/Recognized Institutes shall be appointed only by direct recruitment through a selection procedure.
- (2) The post of the Principal/Dean/Director of affiliated College/Recognized Institute shall be a non-vocational post.
- (3) The appointment of Principal/Dean/Director of affiliated College/Recognized Institute shall be made by an Appointing Authority on the recommendations of the Selection committee.
- (4) The Selection committee for the post of Principal/Dean/Director of affiliated Colleges shall be consisting of the following: (As per section 75 of the Act)

### 11. Enplanement of Expert Committee for Selection of Teachers

Dr. Katti informed the Academic Council that as per the University Act and Rules and Regulations, that Vice- Chancellor nominates experts of the Selection Committee of teachers of affiliated colleges/ recognized institutes: Also the college is supposed to take experts from the panel of approved teachers published on University's website.

The Composition of the Selection Committee shall be consisting of the following:

- i) Chairman, Governing Body/Management or his/her nominee.
- ii) One member to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.
- iii) One member belonging to SC/ST/VJNT/OBC/SBC, nominated by the Vice-Chancellor. Attendance of the said member is mandatory to constitute the quorum of the Selection Committee for selection for the post earmarked for the reservation category.
- iv) One subject expert in each subject to be nominated by the Governing Body/Management of the concerned College/Recognized Institute from the prescribed panel of approved teachers of affiliated Colleges/Recognized Institutes published by the University on its official website. Provided that, the designation of the subject expert so nominated shall be always equal or higher than the designation of post(s) for which the selection committee is being constituted. Attendance of this Subject expert is mandatory to constitute the quorum as Selection Committee.
- v) Principal/ Dean/Director of the College/Recognized Institute.
- vi) The Head of the concerned Department of the College/Recognized Institute.
- vii) One representative belonging to SC/ST/ VJNT/ OBC/SBC, from the concerned College/Institute selection for the post earmarked for the reservation category.

The college will suggest the Names of the Expert Members as in (ii) & (iii) above to be nominated by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor as per Criteria in Table Experts to be empaneled, from which Hon'ble Vice Chancellor will nominate one each.

7.2 Disposal of written answer papers: Dr. H.S. Joshi, I/c Controller of Examinations will present the request for guidance about the disposal of used answer papers.

The Controller of Examinations informed the members that the examination section had approximately 1.5 lakh used answer papers of previous Academic Years which were scanned and the results had been declared. The number is likely to be increased every semester and for the current semester the number of answer papers used is expected to be 1.3 lakhs (i.e about 2.6 lakhs for the Academic Year 2018-19). Right now we have scanning centers only at three locations namely at Loners, Kolhapur (Vathar), and Jalgaon. Out of which the scanning center is being run in a rented premise at Kolhapur ( Vathar), and Jalgaon. Hence, we are facing problems with keeping these answer papers at these centers.

Moreover, it may please be noted that we have adopted the policy of digital evaluation. Thus each paper is scanned before evaluation. The soft copy of the answer papers are always with us which can be used as evidence in case of any discrepancies.

In view of the above mentioned facts, it was requested to suggest and formulate the policy for disposal of used/written answer papers at regular intervals.

“Resolved that answer books of an examinations be disposed of by appropriate method, a year after declaration of the result of the said examinations.”
